













Healthcare crisis (U.S.)

 Healthcare costs have increased over the past few decades, from 5 percent of GDP in 1960 to 18 percent in 2021

 48 million unpaid caregivers in the United States. Nine out of ten of them care for a relative, and half of those are the recipient's children or children-in-law.

 More than 175 rural hospitals closed between since 2005
