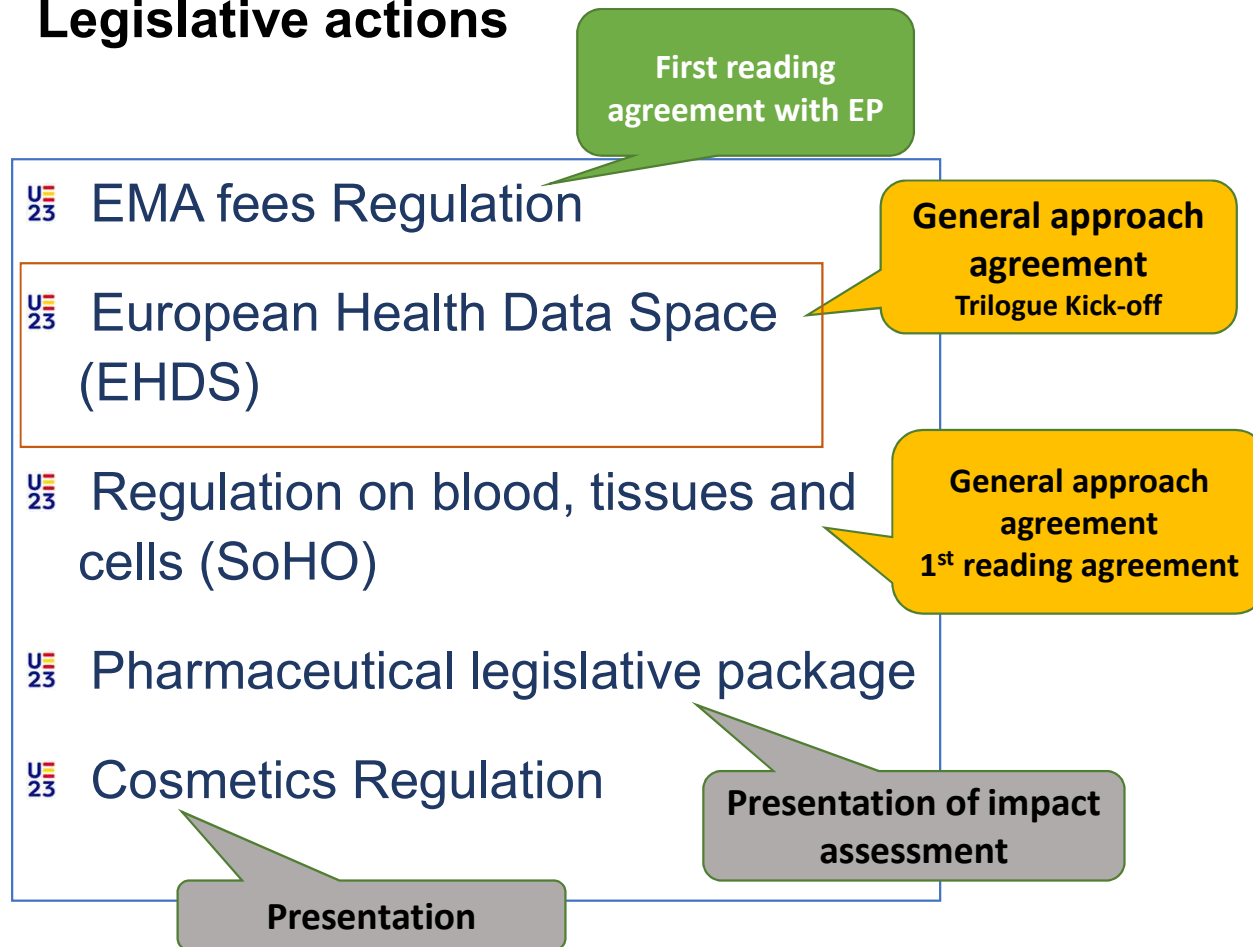

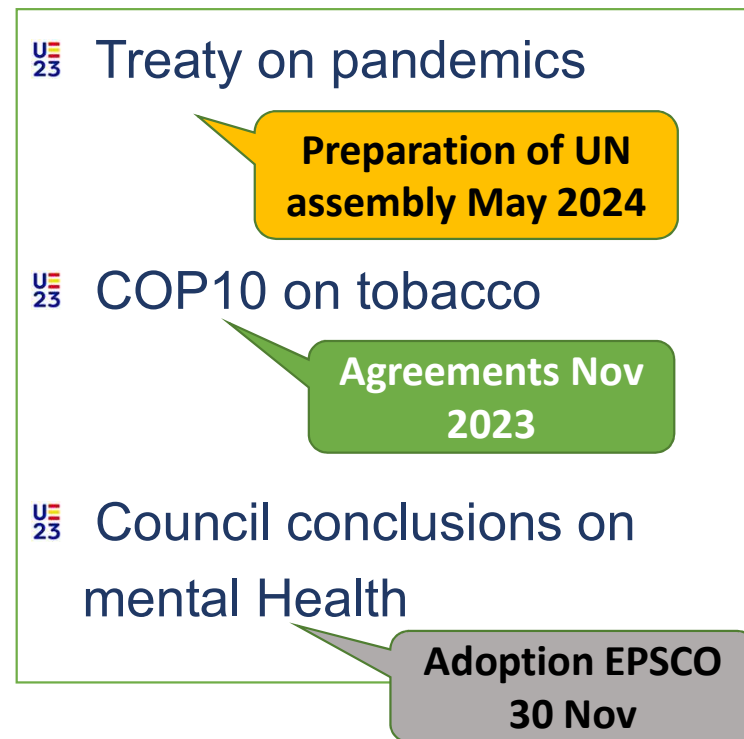

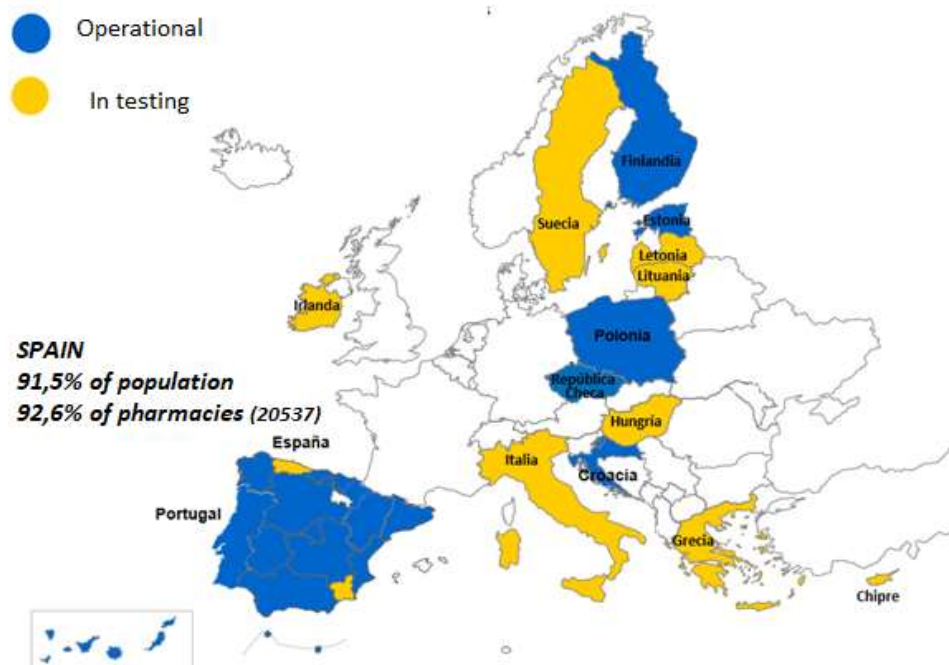


The E-Health Network

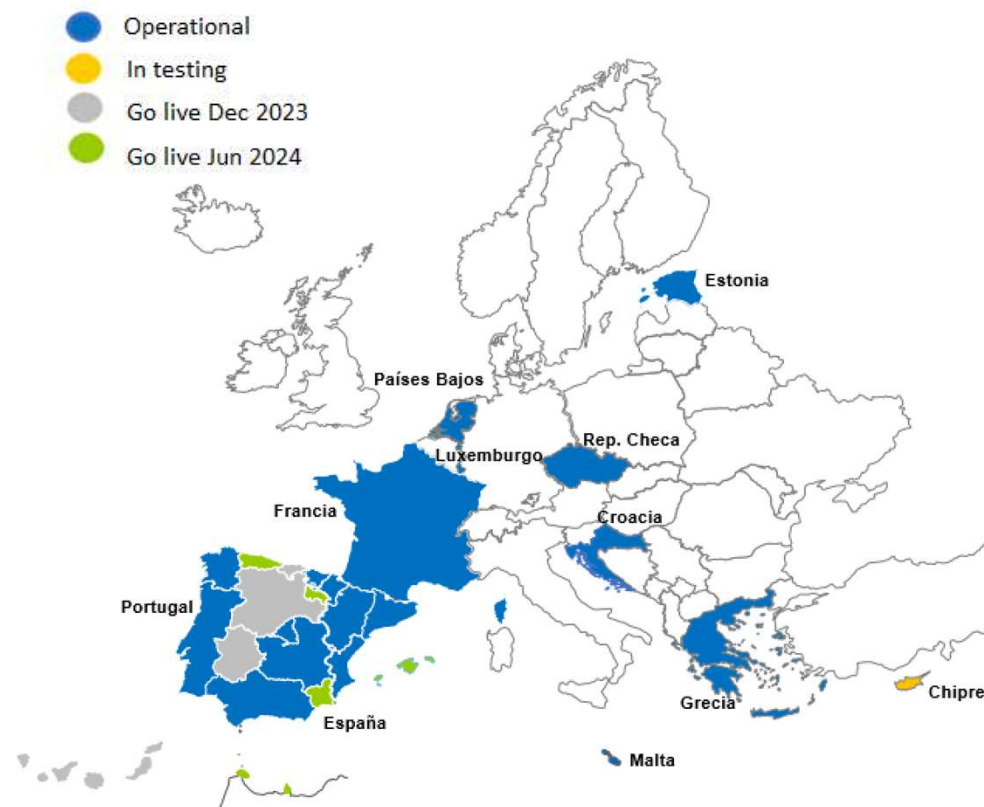

E-Prescription / e-Dispensation



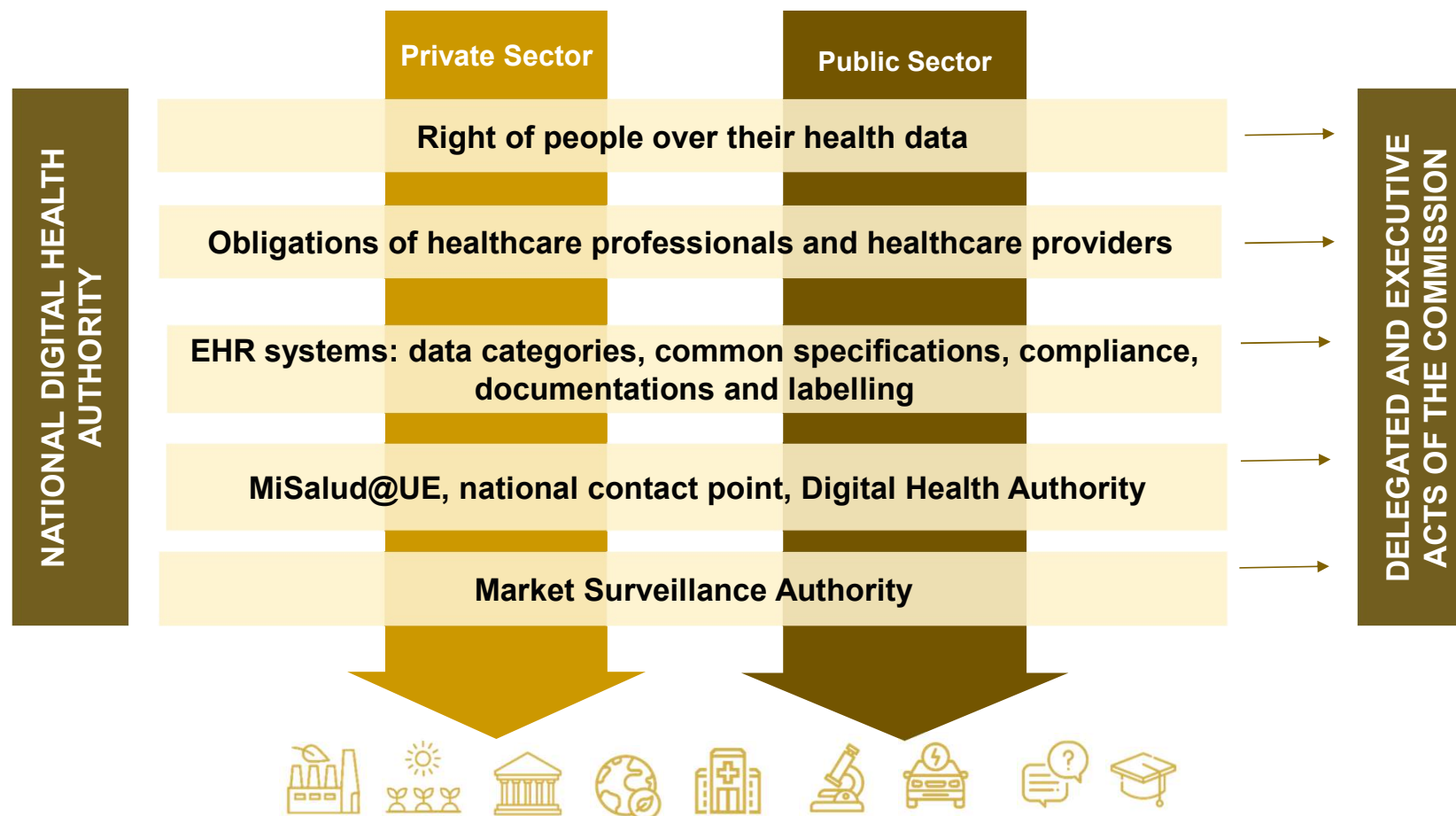
European Patient Summary (EUPS)



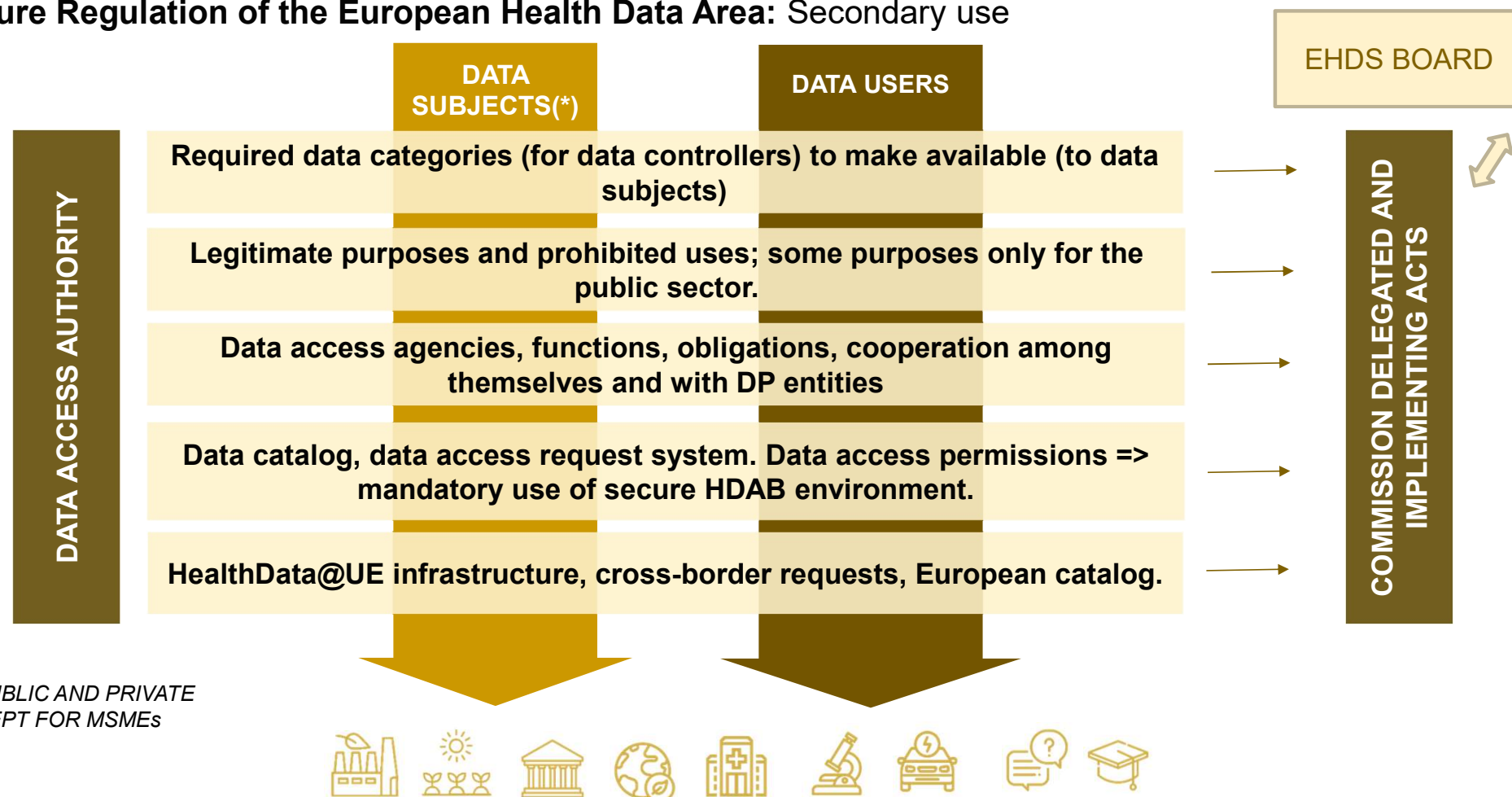

DIGITAL HEALTH STRATEGY OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH SYSTEM

The challenges of the health systems: WHY

Accelerated **increase in the demand** for health services (aging population, changes in less healthy lifestyles, chronic diseases...) **growth in citizens' expectations** regarding the quality of care (health technologies), **strong increase in the volume of information** (to be used and shared by patients and professionals).

01/

Greater medical complexity

More than 50 million people in Europe live with more than one chronic disease.

02/

Increased life expectancy

The increase in life expectancy in Europe (now 81.2 years) causes a growth in the demand of health services

03/

Increased mobility of European citizens

The increase in mobility represents a challenge for the control and prevention of diseases, as well as for the coordination of national health services.

04/

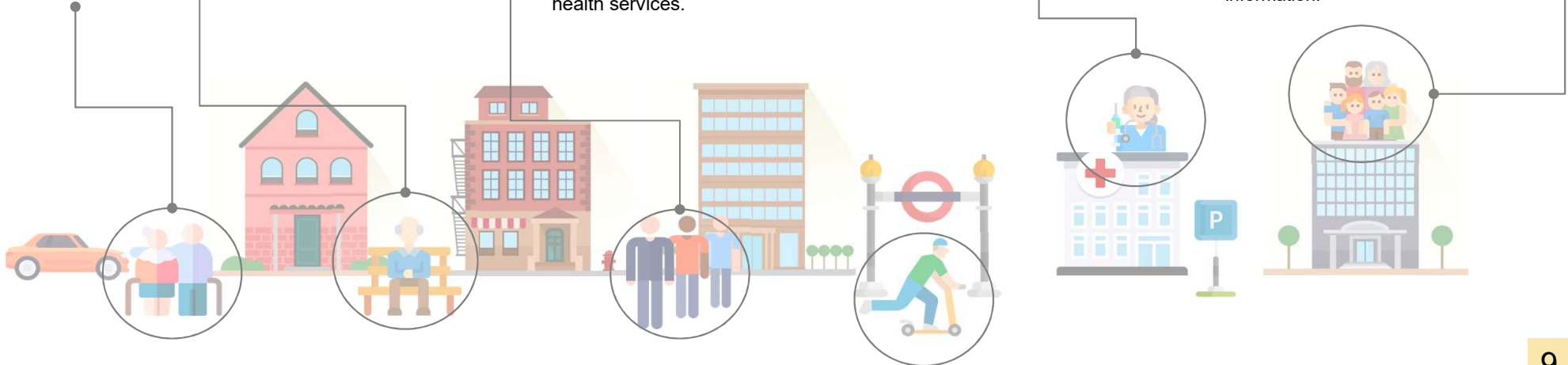
Health personnel

The EU health and long-term care workforce will need to grow by 11 million workers between 2018 y 2030 to meet the demands of an aging population.

Digitization and accessibility of services

Users demand complementary models of care: accessible, effective, independent of location and with the availability of all their medical information.

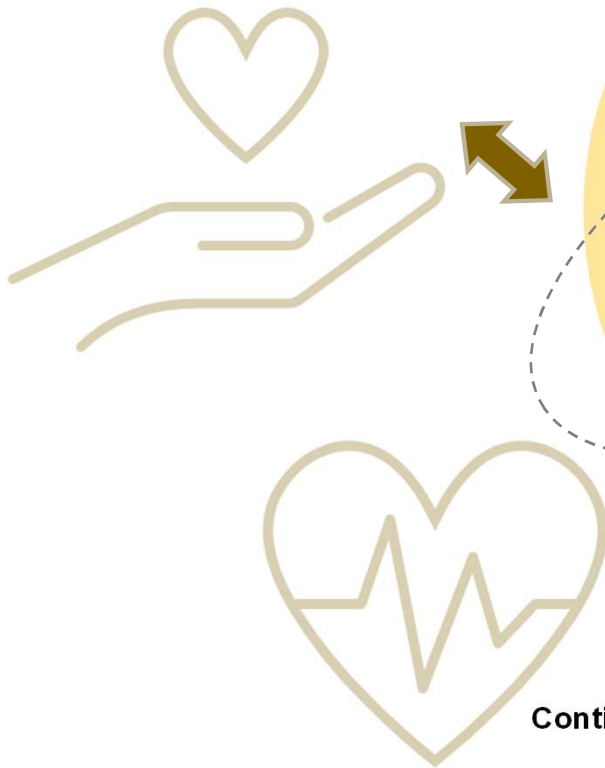

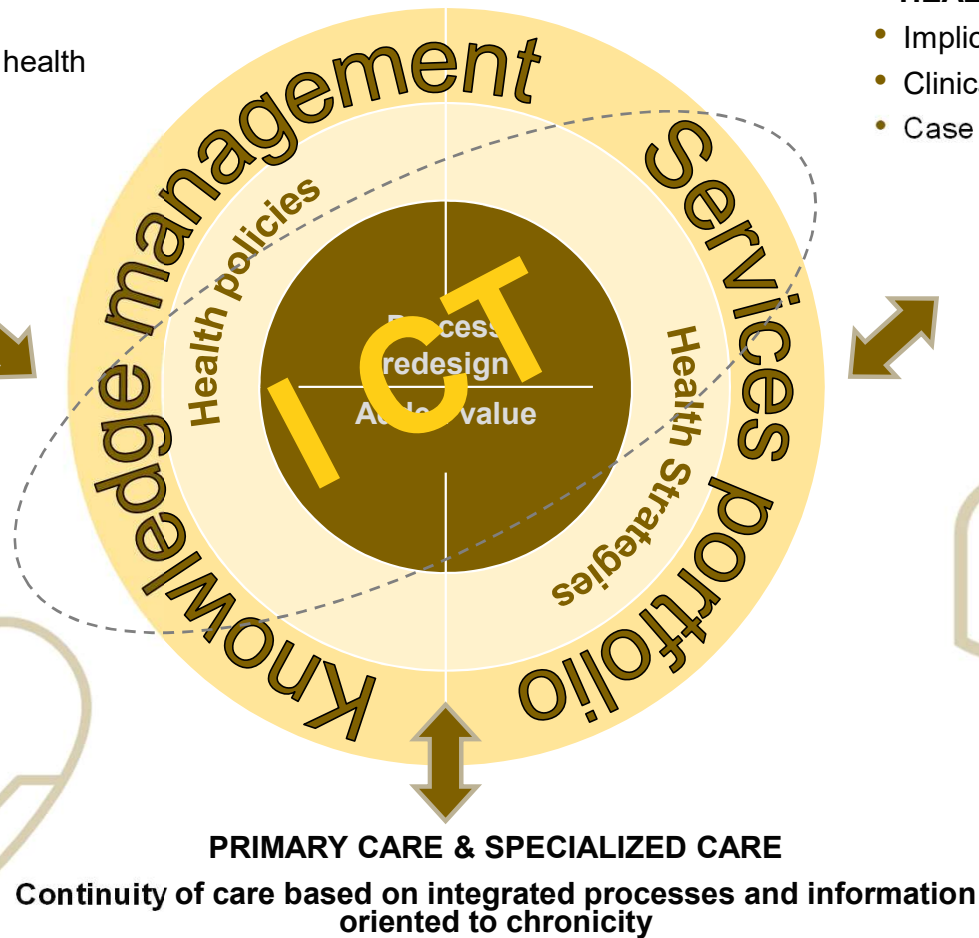
