




The E-Health Network












THE DIGITAL HEALTH STRATEGY OF THE NHS: WHAT IS IT?

It is aimed to contribute to the maintenance of a **good level of health** in the Spanish population and to **strengthen the public health system** through the transformative capacity of **digital technologies** focused on **patients, health professionals, service providers** and other agents involved.



THE DIGITAL HEALTH STRATEGY OF THE NHS: framework

AIM => to generate scalable and replicable projects at the national level. Projects are carried out with three different execution models, depending on the distribution of competencies in **each functional area of the 10** identified in the Strategy.



The ESD projects will generate assets (models, standards, use cases, algorithms, applications or services) that will be presented to the CISNS Digital Health Commission and may be adopted as SNS standards and implemented in any Health Service.
